Crafting with Feminism

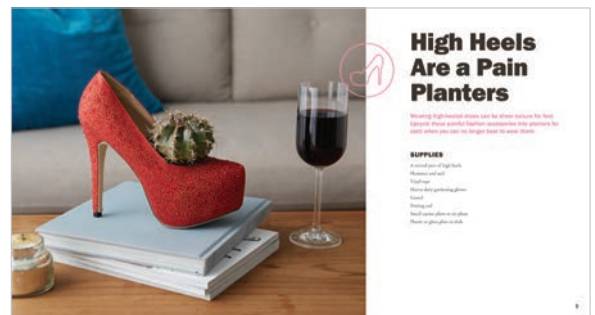
25 Girl-Powered Projects to Smash the Patriarchy
