


#3 – The Day Of The Big Bear





When she was younger, Little Apple's grandmother cooked a new dish every day of the week: chicken on Monday, grilled cheese on Tuesday, zucchini casserole on Wednesday, and so on. She used to keep all the leftovers and when Saturday finally came around, grandma would invent a strange but delicious special recipe with all of them. Now, Little Apple eats lunch at the school but on Saturday nights she and her mother do the same thing she used to do with grandma...

An original concept: a concise and dynamic text with all of the dialogue appearing in speech bubbles that make it easier to learn to read.





Who is hiding behind this strange teacher?




#4 - The Magic Notebook Of The Wildest Wishes

#5 - The Druid Forest




#1 - A Furry friend!

To survive the end of the world, three teenagers who have nothing in common must come together with their strenghts and differences.










PEM PEM'S LIZARD
