

- The prose takes you to wonderful places and the illustrations are exquisite.


David Aceituno (Badalona, 1977)) holds a degree in Philosophy from the Central University of Barcelona. He is the author of the poems *Sylvia & Ted* and *Hogar* [Home]. Together with illustrator Roger Olmos, he has published the albums *Besos que fueron y no fueron* [Kisses that were and kisses that weren't], translated in Italy and Brazil, and *Regálame un beso* [Give me a kiss], which won first prize for Best Published Children's Book; he is also the author of the books *Ensueños* [Daydreams], with illustrations by Conrad Roset, and *Encantadas* [Enchanted], illustrated by Esther Gili. In 2016 he published *Augurio* [Omen], his first novel.

Roger Olmos (Barcelona, 1975)) is a freelance illustrator who has won the Llibreter Book Award for best illustrated book, has been selected 3 times in the Bologna Fair, and whose books *Regálame un beso*, and *La leyenda de Zum* [The legend of Zum] have received the prize for Best Illustrated Book, among many other distinctions. He has published around 60 national and international titles.

Otto has just turned four and he's received the best gift imaginable: a sheriff costume! To celebrate, he decides to go to the park and have all the children obey his orders. Some are Indians, others work in the stable and there are even those in charge of the local inn and jail. Even though the others complain, Otto is always the sheriff and they play the same game every day. However, one day Otto arrives at the park and finds it empty... Have they gotten tired of him being so bossy?

Sam G. C. (Gavà, 1978) is a graphic designer, writer, illustrator and cartoonist. His works include *Lunes Birmanes* [Burmese Moons], nominated at the Clermont Ferrant 2013 festival as the best graphic novel about travelling, and Notre Histoire [Our Story], which sold more than 30,000 copies of its first print in French alone. He has also written short stories and currently edits the magazine *Tantrum* (Impresiones Privadas, 2018).


He works sporadically for the video game industry making posters, T-shirts, storyboards, stage designs and characters.

David Ramírez first became known when he won the first novel prize at the I Barcelona Manga Fair in 1995. Thanks to his success, he was able to write *B3* published by Camaleón Ediciones, and though the series would eventually be left unfinished, it was a good example of his dedication to the humorous genre that won over the public. This meant that he soon received other commissions for humorous pieces for various manga magazines, such as *Dibus!* where he had to soften his surrealist style to adapt to a younger audience.

The artist can boast a diverse range of works including a multitude of comic strips, a webcomic on Instagram and the successful *Japanese for manga people*.

Here you will discover the gang of mischievous monsters including Victor Van Pire, Piruja the witch, Momo, Frankie Jr. and Lupo, and the adventures they got up to in Villa Susto. A fun-filled classic full of humour for young and adult audiences alike!

This artbook is a collection of the best illustrations and unpublished creations by Laia López. The reader will find sketches, fanarts, fun facts about the artist and texts in which she herself comments on her compositions and the creative process behind her work. In addition to all this, the book also explains anecdotes, explores the source of her inspiration and gives advice for illustrators and artists.

- Magela has brought a great deal of experience to the project, as she has edited successful books along the same lines.



Speaking out against prejudice and embracing tolerance, justice and respect is more necessary now than it has ever been. This book takes an entertaining, unpretentious look at situations of sexism and LGBTphobia that society has now normalised. Pandora Mirabilia is a feminist, cross-disciplinary women's cooperative. Feminism and the gender perspective are at the core of all their activity. Mar Guixé is a popular illustrator that is best loved for her lively drawings and pop culture references. A Fine Arts graduate specialising in drawing and character design, she has collaborated with several media outlets and this is her third published book.
