Lawrence Schimel (New York, 1971) is a full-time author, writing in both Spanish and English, who has published over one hundred books in a wide range of genres. He is also a prolific literary translator.

His picture books have been selected for the White Ravens from the International Youth Library in Munich, Germany, twice chosen for IBBY's Outstanding Books for Young People with Disabilities, and won a Crystal Kite Award from the Society of Children's Book Writers and illustrators, among many other awards, honors, and distinctions.



And one Sunday, he asks her over the phone if she would like to come and see him. She is excited to see her father again at last! But it turns out that she will not just be going to visit, but to live with him, far away, in another country. Since he doesn't know what is wrong with Nieves, he begins to fear the worst, imagining if she's covered with spots. And because he hasn't been told anything, when they arrive, he is afraid that everything she touches might be contagious. Since his parents have





been hiding the truth from him, he won't trust anyone except for Nieves' boyfriend, who explains to him what HIV is and isn't, how it's transmitted, etc. Once he knows the truth, Daniel loses his fear and is able to enjoy the weekend and share with his aunt their favorite pastime: flying kites.

In 2010, the World Health Organization declared that HIV/ AIDS was the number one cause of death in the world for women between 15 and 44. But portrayals of HIV positive women are lacking in our cultural imagery.

A non-fiction appendix talks further about what HIV is or isn't.
