Little Italy, New York, April 1895. When he looks at the hospital room, above the bed he sees a man eaten through drugs. He feels anger. He feels tired, infinitely tired. And he feels ashamed, because he knows that to others that wizened dummy is just a junkie, a worthless poor man. But for him it is different, the man is his father.

It is yet another hospital, yet another fall.

In the past, the father has always found the strength to come out of it, although each time it was more exhausting. He who has never shied away from fatigue, neither at work, as long as he managed to keep one, nor in the mountains, where with sure steps he lead his son as a child first and then as a young boy.

The relationship between the two has been made up of continuous substractions, with drugs eroding the normality of their bond, until the inevitable reversal of roles.

And it is again the son who has to take care of the father.

But this time is different. This time, after the fall, there will be no getting up again. It might just be the end of everything, or it might become an opportunity to overcome their respective wounds and find something authentic to save.

A painfully honest novel that, through the protagonist's point of view, offers a fresh reading of the problem of drug addiction. Not the heartbreak of a parent who sees no a future for his or her child, but the disorientation of a son who must build on the rubble left by his father.

Emanuele Galesi was born in 1980 in Brescia, the city where he lives. He is a journalist and an elementary school teacher. Sei tu il figlio is his first novel, winner of the tenth edition of the Zanibelli Prize.



Nicoletta Sipos THE WAR OF H

Heinrich Stein still holds in his heart the summer he spent on the Baltic Sea. It was 1938 and he was seven years old. It was the first time he had seen the sea and he was struck by all that beauty. With only one regret: being able to go to the beach only in the morning, because in the afternoon the coast was reserved for the maneuvers of the new planes built at the nearby military base in Peneemünde. In that fateful summer, Hitler's war was fast approaching even though the majority of Germans did not want to believe it and European statesmen were under the illusion that they could avoid the use of arms.

Through the memories of Heinrich, the eldest of a brood of five brothers, emerges the daily life of a large, educated and rational bourgeois family that gives the Nazis a detached support but does not go so far as to oppose them.

But the invasion of Poland changes everything. While the military go from victory to victory, occupying immense spaces, bringing home important trophies, for those left at home these are not days of celebration. People are hungry and cold, and the first death notices arrive. The military promised a *blitzkrieg*, but the fighting will go on for more than five years providing immense suffering also to the victors. Even his father, a mild and enlightened man and director of an aircraft factory, will pay a heavy price for a gesture of humanity. Little is said about the misery of the Germans during and after the war, but Heinrich Stein continues to think about it even as an old man, crushed between collective guilt and the bitterness of having been too silent.







THE YEARS OF OUR YOUTH

Oxford, 1993. Nana has died, and two cousins, Julia and Martha Parker, find themselves going through heaps of old mementos in her attic, at the discovery of a past they heard so much about but is now just a distant memory. Leticia's sepia photographs and her old journals tell the story of the love of her life and of a painful family secret. Meretto, 1919. The tiny Tuscan village in the Bisenzio valley is in turmoil. It's been five years since the Great War sent the Parkers scurrying back to England, but now they're about to return to the family estate. Primo Gualtieri, the young son of their gardener, fears their return will upend the delicate balances in his own family, or what is left of them. He still doesn't know it, but Primo will live a summer like no other.

The news of the 1920 workers' riots and peasants' revolts reach even as remote a location as Meretto, but they're just a distant echo, muffled by the stillness of the woods and by the renewed friendship between Letizia, the Parkers' first-born, and Primo.

Over a summer that will forever change both of their lives...

THE YEARS OF MEMORIES

Only a year has passed since young Leticia Parker left the family estate in Meretto, Tuscany, but it seems a lifetime: by now she has become a woman, she is independent and ambitious, prone to the Florentine cultural effervescence. As her, the gardener Primo Gualtieri has also grown up.

Before their eyes, the protests and great changes that make their way in the Italy of the 1920s and 1930s. And amid violence, hatred and love, the dreaded secret of the family heir, Theodore Oswald Parker, his friendship with the young archaeologist Ranuccio Bianchi Bandinelli and with Matilde Castelfranco, and then the marriages, the children, the crimes of the Fascist squadrism, Hitler's visit to Florence. Echoes that reverberate until 1993, when Julia Patel returns to Meretto and must face her grandmother's past and her own future, in order to provide an answer to a drama that struck Val di Bisenzio so many years earlier: what happened to little Virginia?





I don't even try to escape the fate they have in store for me, and I have no idea how final this instant may turn out to be. I liked to think I was brave, but now I find myself scared and inadequate. With no effort at all, a man with a machine gun took over my job at the paper and my whole country.

Sima is twenty years old and a student at Kabul University, the place she has been dreaming of all her life. But on August 15, 2021, the Taliban take over the city and shatter her dreams. She has no choice but to go in hiding, hoping no-one will discover her past. Her friend Aziza is just as frightened. On the verge of a law degree and a career as a lawyer, Aziza is well aware that the few women's rights the new government has promised to uphold are hanging by a thread, and that she is bound to experience the same restrictions and atrocities she heard told in her mother's stories. The two young women have but one hope - Vittoria, the Italian journalist who has done so much for Afghan women and would like to do so much more but finds herself utterly powerless. No-one is allowed to leave Kabul, and even just getting it touch with Vittoria could put all of their lives at risk.

So the story – based on true events – unfolds, through brief text messages, forbidden photos, articles, attempts to cross the frontier.

And it's through the encounter and sometimes the clash of cultures that we realize to what extent we, as citizens of the West, have broken the promises made to Afghanistan and its women especially. We encouraged those women to study, telling them knowledge equals empowerment, identity, and freedom, for the educated can never again be enslaved. And then we up and left, abandoning them to a world where an educated woman is hunted down like an outlaw.

But maybe there's a light at the end of this dark Afghan night.



The chief of police, Michele Lorusso, informs her that the victim is Giorgio De Santis, 23, law student, apprentice in a notary firm and the son of well-known local restaurateurs. The body is lying on the pavement, just outside the warehouse, disfigured by multiple fractures after a 30-feet drop from the peak of the roof. An accident, a suicide, foul play: the coroner is keeping all the options open. It's up to Emma to ascertain the truth. But the fact is she is in no mood to investigate yet another violent death. She is going through a rough patch, feeling lonely, hollow, useless, and has no energy to spare for what she believes was the self-destructive act of a troubled kid from the jeunesse dorée.

But when Lorusso discovers a number of suspicious details in the life and death of De Santis – a rave party at that same warehouse, a violent fight just before he went missing; a wedding plan he may have been trying to get out of, and the not quite legal growing of marijuana – Emma realizes it's time to shake off the blues and throw herself once more, body and soul, into a case that is looking less and less like a suicide.

The body of Giorgio De Santis is lying on the pavement right outside the warehouse, just a few feet from the three-story roof. Lying on his back, in apparent repose. His eyes are half closed and he doesn't look dead. It's like he laid himself down to rest after a long, exhausting journey.

This kid died close to a crowd a people. Close and yet far removed.



Why does he speak of his own heart as if it were an entity other than himself?


And why are there signs of persecution and threats in his house?

Mursili is only nineteen and feels utterly unprepared for the task. But no-one can disobey an order from the king, for he is the link between the gods and men. So Mursili accepts his fate. Many will dispute his valor, conspiring to overthrow him. And many others will surround him with flattery, in the hope of sharing his glory. The way ahead will be treacherous and hard, filled with betrayals and seductions, plagues cast by the gods and ancient prophecies. But still Mursili will be the youngest of kings.

After a university degree in classical studies, Valentina Cambi earned a Ph.D. in Linguistics at Scuola Normale Superiore in Pisa, with a specialization in the Hittite language. 

But the welcome is not the one Ottone nor Matteo, his favorite nephew, would have expected. Milan is ruined by the tributes collected by the della Torre family for the ten-year war against the Visconti, and now people do not want another tyrant.

But that is not the only problem the Viscontis have to face. Within the walls of Milan a new sect has arisen, originated by the followers of a woman of the people, Saint Guglielma, who professes a new vision of God and of the relationship between man and woman and who is hailed as the new Messiah. When the Saint dies and

the sect elects a high priestess, a wise and widely beloved noblewoman who years earlier had left her aristocratic privileges to put herself at the service of Christ, those who hold the power can no longer ignore it. That heresy must be stopped, not least because the favor and support of the Church of Rome are too important to the Visconti, and even a lukewarm support to that abomination could be fatal.

Thus begins one of the most dramatic trials Milan can remember.

Tough choices will have to be made, between what is right and what is convenient, between whom one loves and whom one can sacrifice.



"The intention, as in my previous novel The Innocents, was to narrate what is called the "Bad Renaissance," a century of splendors yes, but also of many horrors. I wanted to tell the contrast between the very hard life of the common people and the wealth and arrogance of the ruling classes, while an epochal revolution in Christendom was being prepared through the speculation and anguish of a simple Augustinian monk."

Valeria Ventura was born in Bologna and now lives in Perugia, she has taught at the University for foreigners as a lecturer of Italian language to foreigners, dealing mainly with phonetics and phonology of Italian. 
LIFE - JEALOUSY

And that is when he begins to find himself.

In the vital and sacred heart of the ancient town Kripala will make simple yet extraordinary encounters, meeting people of humble condition but of fathomless wisdom. A martial arts master, a painter, an older woman caring for the poor, a garden curator... And above them all, threading their destinies together like a masterful tapestry, there is Tatanji, an elderly monk who has retired in an ashram to live with his cats. He will brush the dust from Kripala's eyes, showing him that the happiness he was seeking was already inside him - he just needed to see it.







and the bombings gone down in Italian history as the «Mafia Terror». A feat of reporting and creative imagination; a unique and courageous novel..
