


DIEGO CAJELLI

DIEGO CAJELLI (Milan 1971) is an author, screenwriter, writer for radio and television, and a lecturer in storytelling at the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore in Milan. He writes stories for Sergio Bonelli Editore, Disney and Pixar. In 2008 he was awarded the premio Gran Guinigi at Lucca Comics & Games for best Italian screenwriter. *The Curse of the Mine of Tears* is his debut novel.





He asks her to tell him her story, again and again over the years, until he can feel his grandmother's experience on his own skin, transforming her memory into his own.


ANDRA AND TATIANA BUCCI, two Italian sisters of Jewish descent, survived the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp because they were mistaken for twins, to be used in Doctor Josef Mengele's depraved human experiments. They told their story in *Noi, bambine ad Auschwitz*, published by Mondadori, which sold over 20.000 copies. Mondadori Ragazzi published the children's book adaptation, *Il Baule dei Segreti. Andra and Tati's Star* is the award-winning animated film inspired by their life story.

MARIO CALABRESI, journalist and writer, is the former Editor-in-Chief of the national newspapers La Stampa and La Repubblica. He is the CEO and cofounder of Chora Media, Italy's leading podcast company. His bestsellers include *Spingendo la notte più in là* (2007), *La fortuna non esiste* (2009), *Cosa tiene accese le stelle* (2011), *La mattina dopo* (2019), *Quello che non ti dicono* (2021). His books have been translated in France (Gallimard), Spain (Penguin RH), US (Other Press).





"In piedi nella neve" [Einaudi, 2015] won her the Gigante delle Langhe prize and the Premio Cento; "Sulle onde della libertà" (2015) with Mondadori Ragazzi from which the film The Children of Gaza (2024) is based.




SUMAYA ABDEL QADER

SUMAYA ABDEL Qader was born in Perugia to Jordanian-Palestinian parents. She has been raising awareness of women's rights and the integration of the children of immigrants for more than 20 years. Between 2016 and 2021, she was the first Muslim councillor for the Milan city council. She currently works as a researcher in sociology. She worked as an advisor on the fourth and fifth series of Skam Italia, a cult TV series, and in 2019 her novel Quello che abbiamo in testa was published by Mondadori. She describes herself as a hakawati, a storyteller. In cerca di me is her first novel for children and young adults.
