

Clara, irreverent, grumpy and with a long tongue, tells us a ghost story, which is also about grieving the loss of her mother.

Clara Rot is eleven years old, has a dog without three teeth, a father who is the King of Punishments, a little sister, a fake mother, a real mother - who died years before - and a grandmother who lives in a very old house, Villa Decrepit. A fairly normal life, except that Clara talks to ghosts. The first time it happened she was seven years old and did not know that Mr Martino was dead, but when she saw him perched on the highest branch of an oak tree she became suspicious. That's how she found out she was a vessel, capable of helping the 'gone' to move on, to close what they had left undone in life. And everything runs smoothly, until Mira arrives: although she is undoubtedly dead, the girl does not seek her help and does not seem to want to leave her alone. Quite a problem, since Clara loves solitude.... But when the Shadows begin to stretch over the village of Bellamì, help might be just what she needs most.

ILARIA PALMOSI was born in 1982 and lives in the province of Venice. She teaches Italian at secondary school, has three children, two dogs, loves nature, animals, living by the sea and inventing absurd stories, which she then writes. "I fantasmi di Clara" is her first novel for children.






LILA STORM

A teenager's attempt to comprehend his grandma's experience in the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. A journey through memory and empathy.


Joshua is four years old when he first goes to spend the summer in Italy. Far away from the beaches of his native California, he spends his days with his grandmother, Andra Bucci, one of the few child survivors of Auschwitz. At first, Joshua does not understand and struggles to comprehend the meaning behind the number tattooed on his grandmother's arm. He asks her to tell him her story, again and again over the years, until he can feel his grandmother's experience on his own skin, transforming her memory into his own.

ANDRA AND TATIANA BUCCI, two Italian sisters of Jewish descent, survived the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp because they were mistaken for twins, to be used in Doctor Josef Mengele's depraved human experiments. They told their story in *Noi, bambine ad Auschwitz*, published by Mondadori, which sold over 20.000 copies. Mondadori Ragazzi published the children's book adaptation, *Il Baule dei Segreti. Andra and Tati's Star* is the award-winning animated film inspired by their life story.

MARIO CALABRESI, journalist and writer, is the former Editor-in-Chief of the national newspapers La Stampa and La Repubblica. He is the CEO and cofounder of Chora Media, Italy's leading podcast company. His bestsellers include *Spingendo la notte più in là* (2007), *La fortuna non esiste* (2009), *Cosa tiene accese le stelle* (2011), *La mattina dopo* (2019), *Quello che non ti dicono* (2021). His books have been translated in France (Gallimard), Spain (Penguin RH), US (Other Press).


The bond between two young boys that allowed them to remain human and return together from Auschwitz-Birkenau camp.

Sami Modiano and Piero Terracina are just two boys when they first meet in the Nazi camp at Birkenau in 1944. One comes from faraway Rhodes, the other from Rome, yet they have something in common: they are Jews and both experience the horror of deportation and the loss of all their loved ones; they can no longer count on anything but their friendship. After the Liberation, their paths diverge for over fifty years. Since this second meeting, they have begun to call each other "brothers" and understand that the only way to bear the past is to testify, to keep memory alive so that certain horrors are never repeated.

SAMI MODIANO, born in Rhodes in 1930, is one of the survivors of the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. Since 2005 he has undertaken a tireless activity to bear witness to the Shoah and to build awareness against all forms of racial hatred. In 2020, he was appointed Knight of the Grand Cross of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic.

MARCO CAVIGLIA, historian of the Shoah Museum Foundation. Also for Mondadori, he collected and shared the precious documents that enabled the creation of the comic novel "16 October 1943. The story of Emanuele who escaped Nazism".

MARCO PAOLINI is an actor, author and director. Since the 1970s he has been recounting the change in Italian society, digging into the past and present and pushing himself to imagine a near future. Known to the general public thanks to the success of Racconto del Vajont, he is famous for his narratives with a strong civil impact.

WHEN THE SKY ISN'T SCARY ANYMORE

DOMENICO QUIRICO

A very sensitive subject, war, told to the children by someone who has always known and told about it.

One year after the first anniversary of the outbreak of war in Ukraine, a book invites reflection and tells children about the words that define war, in order to actively engage in peace.

From the 'Iliad' to 'warriors' who become, in modern times, 'soldiers'. Soldiers who are called 'heroes' and who often 'fear' and 'pity' the 'enemy'. Because in war, it is not always easy to distinguish between victors and vanquished, given the countless broken lives that only 'memory' can recall. Ten words to explain, recount and reflect on what war is, what it entails and why it is necessary to repudiate it always and in any case.

DOMENICO QUIRICO (Asti, 1951) is an important Italian journalist. He is a war reporter and chief foreign correspondent for the national daily La Stampa. He was a correspondent in Paris and covered the events of the Arab Spring, which began in 2010-2011. He was captured for several months in Syria.
