READING EXCERPT

When the world was still young, only just woven together by the fog nymphs from stardust, beeswax and rose thorns, there was a land called Ravenholm.

Rolling hills, grassy plains, mountains thundering with echoes, deep forests and glittering streams. It was a beautiful land that was inhabited by many different beings, such as dwarves, giants or gnomes. However, there were also Gluttongullets and Grimgrislies. What, you've never heard of them? Well, perhaps it's just as well. It would give you bad dreams if you knew that they existed.

But something else was special about Ravenholm. Magic threaded its way through the land like an invisible wisp and those who could perform magic were considered legendary heroes. As if they could work magic... which of course they could.

On the other hand, even the most talented magician would only have been a funny old fogey with a silly hat if they had not owned something that made conjuring possible in the first place - that's right, a magic wand. It was only such a wand that turned Galeron the Grouch into Galeron the Great, who could easily turn ghastly barley porridge into the finest blueberry curd.

Deep in the gorse forest, where the Grey Mountains rose up into the sky in the distance, lived the leaf imps. There was a village with cosy huts with pointed roofs, pretty shutters and loads of steps leading here and there. Sometimes even to nowhere, if an imp had had enough of building steps again. Very simple - they are made of wood and were therefore a speciality of the leaf imps.

This is because magic wands can only be made under a glittering starry sky and this is what the two of them were doing. Master Whittlewood was, as his name gives away, a master in magic wand carving and Glim was his apprentice.

In imp years, Glim was four guarter twelvety and therefore still rather young. And perhaps we should add a word here about what the leaf imps looked like. Compared to beings that are bigger than them, they are quite small. At best as big as the nasty musk gnome, who is as big as two and a half owls one above the other but whose smell is much more pungent. Furthermore, leaf imps have pointed noses, greenish shimmering skin, small brown eyes and curly hair. Despite what some people might think, they do not have funny drop-shaped ears, but they do always have a craving for waffles made with chestnut flour. In winter they don coats made of moss, in summer shirts made of finely woven fern. The whole year round, on the other hand, they wear every conceivable kind of hat, with or without a bobble, often with adornments made of acorns, snail shells and ivy. Imps are therefore almost invisible in the forest when they are not moving.

Glim woke up to a brilliant spring day. She could already hear the hustle and bustle from outside. The imps were busy decorating their village with colourful garlands for the spring festival.

Glim stretched, put on her green imp hat with the sewed on earmuffs and strode to the workshop, where Master Whittlewood had already baked chestnut waffles and placed a pot of lime blossom tea on the workbench.

"So, are you nervous about the speech?" He grinned at Glim as he poured her a cup of tea.

"Oh, my goodness, the speech!" The little imp had forgotten all about that.

"Not to worry, everyone has long since forgotten my speech back then," Whittlewood reassured her.

Glim nodded and then sighed sadly. "How long were you wandering after that?"

The Master thought about it for a moment. "A very long while," he then said. And when he noticed that Glim did not exactly look very cheerful, he added hastily: "But you know the old saying: once an imp has seen the world with their own eves..."

"... then they can be late to rise," Glim added with a smile and took a sip of lime blossom tea.
