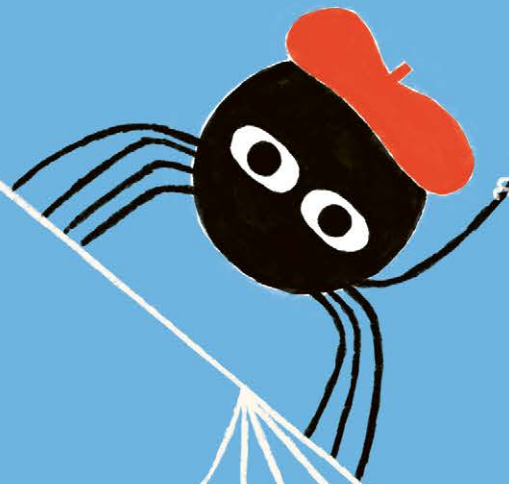

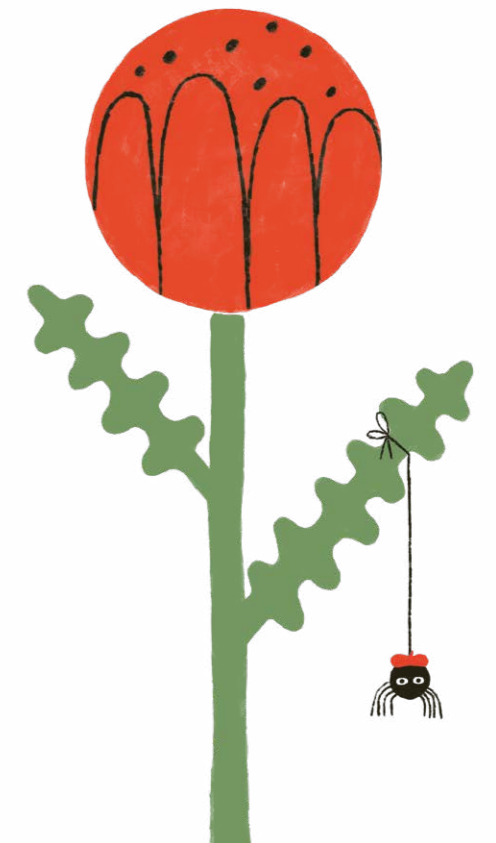
And we’re rounding off the list with a beautiful non-fiction look at the history of mountaineering and all the obstacles that women in particular had to face to reach the top(s).
