

Story: Nothing is more important to journalist Ellie than justice. She dares to speak the truth, even when it's uncomfortable. Yet no one suspects the true reason she fights so passionately for those who have no voice. Or why she avoids relationships. Or why she broke up so suddenly with Louis, her first true love. Being sexually abused as a child shattered Ellie's heart into a thousand pieces, and each day that she walks her own path means putting one more piece back in place. When Ellie is assigned to cover an explosive story about abuse of power, her investigation takes her to none other than Louis. Soon, she finds herself caught between the truth and her deepening feelings...

Tropes: Second Chances, First Love, He falls first

Topics: sexual abuse, mental health

Protagonists: *Ellie (25)* was abused as a child. Today she is an investigative journalist. She has a professional life, but hasn't had a relationship since Louis. *Louis (25)* Ellie's great love from the past. He works for a company that is the target of Ellie's research. He still has great feelings for her, but is also afraid of losing his job and asks her to keep quiet.

Author: For Antonia Wesseling, born in 1999, writing is a major part of life. She started coming up with stories when she was little, then went on to write YA books, and is now the author of bestselling new-adult novels. She talks about writing, mental health and other topics close to her heart on YouTube (@tonipure), TikTok and Instagram (@antoniawesseling).

Storyteller: Lena (@lenajensn) is a survivor of sexual violence, a speaker, a Miss Germany runner-up, an entrepreneur and a mother. She campaigns for child abuse awareness and equal parenting rights. She lives in northern Germany with her husband and child.

Story: Emilian is a real nice guy. Everyone thinks so. Except his supervisor Vienna, who seems immune to his charms and constantly makes snide comments. Unfortunately, now the two of them are supposed to trial a new dating app for a new marketing client... The more closely they work together, the hotter their chats get, and the more they confide in each other. For the first time, Emilian feels like he can really open up to someone else, including about his painful childhood. And Vienna, too, is relieved to finally be herself again around a guy. But just as their secret office affair is about to turn more serious, Emilian's stepdad shows up and threatens to ruin his life. Emilian has to make a difficult decision, which will affect not only him and Vienna, but Vienna's young son too...

Tropes: Grumpy x Sunshine, Office Romance, Found Family

Topics: emotional blackmail, emancipation, liberation

Protagonists: *Emilian* (21) was left with his violent, gambling-addicted stepfather after the death of his mother. As an adult, he avoids serious relationships for fear of adopting his stepfather's narcissistic behaviour. *Vienna* (22) is a single mother of a young son. She is focused on her career as men have always disappointed her.

Author: Cassidy Cane, born in 1993, started out penning fan fiction and hasn't stopped writing since. Now a novelist in her own right, she takes her characters through all of life's highs and lows. She describes herself as 'selective but intense' in terms of her passions: she is a F1 fanatic and film buff, wears a different baseball cap every day (she's the proud owner of at least twenty!), and on her 'reading days' loves immersing herself heart and soul in romance and fantasy novels. Assuming, that is, her cat Coco and Bichon Frisé Poet stop competing for her attention!

Storyteller: Kevin, born in 1992, is a marketing manager and lives in southern Germany with his wife and two daughters. He left home at a young age, and for a long time was triggered by the topic of his family. However, he finally managed to draw a line under it – and when he fell in love with a colleague, it gave him a chance at a fresh start. Kevin has always been drawn to writing and the stage, and he now turns his experiences into poems he performs at slam poetry events. He firmly believes that 'If you're good, life's good.'





Story: Following a tragic shooting at her school that ended in the death of her best friend, Lina wants nothing more than to get out of town and forget the past. She leaves everything behind – including Liam, who was there for her during the bad times. Years later, when she meets Tom and falls in love, Lina finally starts feeling safe again. But what starts as a blissful relationship soon turns into a nightmare: Tom is controlling, and humiliates and gaslights her. It takes a long time for Lina to pluck up the courage to leave him and go back to the people who were there for her last time. To her surprise, she discovers that Liam is still there too... and the mess in her head seems to quieten down whenever he's around. But can two broken hearts help each other heal?

Tropes: Second Chance, Broken Heros, Childhood Lovers, Friends to Lovers

Topics: trauma, healing, mental health


Protagonists: *Lina (25)* was 16 when she survived a school shooting, and started having panic attacks; she works as an trained educator. *Liam (25)*, is Lina's ex-boyfriend and former classmate; Lina broke up with him even though she was in love with him

Author: Justine Pust lives in Rostock and has blue hair. She is a real seaside girl, known far and wide for her @justinepust Instagram account, where she shares her passion for writing and reading. For Justine, life is unimaginable without books. She is also a social worker, with a deep interest in people's life stories – as evidenced by her new novel for {heartlines}, When the Rain Burns.

Storyteller: Sina is an educator with an MA in social education. In 2009, a former fellow student went on a shooting spree at her school, an event which left her deeply traumatised and suffering from panic attacks. She sought refuge in a relationship with a man who promised her love, but in fact abused her both physically and emotionally. She eventually managed to escape; a stay at a clinic and trauma therapy helped her to recover. Sina has now moved back to her home town – and finally found the love of her life.

Pieces of me

Based on Tara's True Story

Story: Tara has everything she's ever dreamed of. She is a promising law student and has a wonderful boyfriend, and loves her adoptive parents. She's never had much interest in her Nepalese roots, and usually ignores anything to do with the country. But on her birthday, a stranger called Kiran gets in touch claiming he's her brother. Tara is shocked and has a thousand questions – and in the hope of finding some answers, she flies to Kathmandu. There, she meets the family she never knew. She also meets Ravi, and starts developing feelings for him. But the more Tara settles into the country of her birth, the more alienated she feels from her old self. Where – and to whom – does she really belong?

Tropes: Slow Burn, Finding Yourself, New Beginnings

Topics: Where do I belong? And to whom?

Protagonists: *Tara (25),* was adopted when she was a baby; *Ravi (26),* Nepalase and Tara's brother Kiran's best friend.

Author: Vanessa Hußmann, born in 1992, loves getting to know unfamiliar worlds – be they books or fascinating countries and cultures. Her favourite way to immerse herself in a novel is surrounded by fairy lights and scented candles. She constantly longs to visit faraway countries, and has spent a year in the US and travelled around Thailand and Vietnam. She got to know Kathmandu thanks to Tara, who mentally guided her through the city's alleyways and temples. Vanessa found its mystical atmosphere and welcoming people inspiring: '*Pieces of Me* is like a journey to Nepal, and I hope you'll fall in love with it, as I did – and perhaps with Ravi, too.'

Storyteller: 'Tara' is the pen name of the woman whose story is told in *Pieces of Me*. Born in 1999, she was adopted by a German couple at the age of three. Tara's adoptive parents told her early on about her background, but she never found out why her biological mother gave her up, or what happened to her other family. However, one day, at the age of seventeen, she received an unexpected message from Nepal that prompted her to make her first ever trip to her native country. Although Tara doesn't really enjoy being in the limelight, she hopes her story will inspire others who have had similar experiences, and anyone who sometimes simply feels lost.

Story: Leyla is still little when her family leaves Lebanon for Germany. But her mother never gets over having to leave her homeland, and commits suicide. In her grief, Leyla finds solace in dancing. She and her brother Said are close, but when she moves to Berlin to start up her own studio their relationship becomes strained. One day, Leyla bumps into Emir, Said's best friend. Emir used to take her to her dance lessons every evening, and always believed that dreams can come true. He also once kissed her on a cold November night – even though kissing your mate's sister is against the rules. As Leyla and Emir grow closer, they can't resist recalling those old feelings. But Said isn't too happy about it: the reason he sent Emir to Berlin in the first place was to sabotage Leyla's dream...

Tropes: forbidden love, brother's best friend

Topics: false pretences, losing someone's trust, traditional family, cultural differences

Protagonists: Leyla (23) her greatest passion is dancing, her biggest dream is to have her own dance studio. Emir (25) studies physics in Berlin and was once her brother's best friend.

Author: Rabia Doğan has an MA in psychology and lives in Berlin, where she is training to be a psychotherapist. Rabia has been writing ever since she realised how much other people and their stories fascinate her. She shares two things with Batul: both are from an immigrant background, and both are proud of their roots.

Storyteller: Batul's family is from Lebanon and moved to Germany when she was four. After Batul's mother committed suicide, her older brother became her guardian. He encouraged her passion for dance, and Batul – who is in her mid-twenties – now runs her own dance studio in Chemnitz.

She is relieved to finally be discharged from the rehab centre, and looking forward to making a fresh start and returning to uni. At the same time, she knows that she's as yet a former alcoholic on probation. When she sees former fellow student Tim again, he seems to be exactly what she needs. Despite everything she's been through, she trusts him. But Tim isn't as strong as he thinks, and unlike Nora keeps his worries to himself. Torn between love and doubt, each has to ultimately face up to their past.

Tropes: Broken Hero, Slow Burn

Topics: alcoholism, withdrawal, therapy

Protagonists: *Nora* (26) To get her panic attacks under control, she drank. Now she is sober. She is studying German and is currently writing her master's thesis. *Tim* (26) is in great financial difficulties and his parents have broken off contact with him.

Author: Mira Massong, born in 1996, lives in Cologne with her husband, daughter and two cats. She has a degree in German and psychology, and is a freelance editor. Mira started writing stories when she was just seven, and since 2016 has devoted herself mainly to the romance genre. Her new {heartlines} book *Break the Fall*, written together with Laura, is an authentic, accessible new-adult novel about a former alcoholic called Nora, inspired by Laura's own true story..

Storyteller: Laura graduated from high school, got her degree and started her first job, all while under the influence. She drank her first beer at the age of 16, and was quickly drawn into a vicious circle of binge- and secret drinking. She has been dry for three years now, and knows that only total abstinence will keep her from relapsing. Laura writes openly about life after alcohol on Instagram (@laurassoberlife), and hopes to raise greater awareness of the topic via her videos and this new {heartlines} novel.

Years of being paralysed by fear of her brother's violent outbursts has taken its toll. The only way she can find release is by exercising. At first, she doesn't notice how her workouts are taking over her life, but eventually she can't get through the day without exercising for several hours. On a weekend away with Linus, she's forced to make a choice – and chooses exercise. She distances herself from Linus, and pushes her own body to such limits that, soon, her life is in danger...

Tropes: strangers to lovers, I have a secret, emotional scars, golden retriever boyfriend

Topics: Information about developmental trauma, demarginalisation of sports addiction

Author: Jennifer Wiley, born in 1988, lives near Cologne. She has a degree in social work and spent many years helping families through difficult situations, before devoting herself full-time to writing deeply emotional romances. She loves hiking and exploring nature on horseback, and recharges her batteries on the banks of a small fishing lake that reminds her of times spent with her father. She describes herself as both bubbly and a daydreamer, and watching a new series always well and truly brings out the fangirl in her.

Storyteller: Rike, born in 1995, is a psychologist and lives in Cologne. She is a mental health activist, has already coached people and educated them on topics related to mental health in her own podcast. As a result of developmental trauma, Rike became addicted to sports, but was able to free herself from this addiction through trauma therapy. Rike still loves sports – in moderation – as well as photography and painting. She wants to raise awareness of the connection between trauma and mental disorders and share her message with those affected
