





Giovanni Emidio Palaia




Carlo Acutis died at 15 of acute myeloid leukemia. The church in downtown Milan where his funeral was celebrated was packed. The crowd included many of the homeless people that Carlo helped every day. The grandson of the founder of a leading insurance company, Carlo had been born to wealth and had never wanted for anything. But like Saint Francis he did not care for comforts and riches, and dedicated his life to others.


Media outlets from all around the world have depicted Carlo as the greatest saint of our times, and the Church defined him as «the patron saint of the Internet».

THE COURAGE TO TAKE A CHOICE My journey with Saint Augustine Davide Banzato

Making choices is never easy, especially when life presents us with complex dilemmas where the line between good and evil becomes blurred. How can we overcome our deepest fears? How can we choose the best possible option when all the alternatives seem imperfect? How can we succeed in being free? Don Davide does not offer ready-made answers to these questions, but rather ideas for embarking on a personal and authentic search. In doing so, he draws on the support of a great figure from history: Saint Augustine. A fascinating character who experienced profound contradictions and who, precisely because of his restlessness and his mistakes, became a source of inspiration for Davide during the most delicate moments of his journey. A restless and passionate man, capable of falling and getting back up again and again, Augustine tirelessly sought truth and authentic love. He continues to speak to the hearts of modern men and women, inviting them not to fear doubt, not to flee from restlessness, and to have the courage to change. The book also addresses current issues such as the theory of "just war," of which Augustine was the architect. This text does not seek to lecture, but rather to offer keys to navigating the storms of life without fear of difficult choices. For it is precisely through these choices that we build our truest freedom

Born in 1981 and appointed "Missionary of Mercy" by Pope Francis, Don Davide Banzato serves disadvantaged young people in the Nuovi Orizzonti community, on missions in Italy and abroad. He has received several awards for his work as a journalist for newspapers, radio, and television. For Piemme, he has published the bestsellers *Tutto ma prete mai* (Everything but a priest, 2021, 40,000 copies sold) and *Cerca il tuo orizzonte* (Seek your horizon, 2023), in dialogue with Pope Francis. With Mondadori Electa, he has published the book *Un pezzo di cielo solo per te* (A piece of sky just for you, 2024) addressed to younger readers.




A multifaceted man who experienced profound contradictions and who, precisely because of his restlessness and his mistakes, became a point of reference for Don Davide in the most delicate moments; a restless and passionate soul, constantly searching for truth and authentic love, capable of speaking to everyone's heart and encouraging us not to fear doubt, not to flee from turmoil, and to have the courage to change.

"In certain situations, the choice we have to make does not involve the ideal or perfect option, but only two difficult alternatives: the lesser evil or the greatest possible good. In these cases, our freedom and discernment are put to the test in a profound way. These are the kinds of decisions that require a high degree of maturity, responsibility, and discernment, as they force us to understand what is truly important to us, what our core values are, and what we can do to act in a just and responsible manner even when the alternatives are inadequate or imperfect. This situation is often a test of our ability to navigate between good and evil, to choose consciously while being aware of the difficulties and nuances that each option entails. Pope Francis rightly and convincingly stated that reality is superior to ideas. We are called to live only in the present, with its concreteness and its often harsh, insidious, and unpredictable reality for which we never feel adequately prepared."



FRANCESCO: THE POPE OF MERCY Jorge Mario Bergoglio seen up close Andrea Tornielli

Andrea Tornielli, since 2018 editorial director of the Holy See's Dicastery for Communication, writes a moving portrait of Jorge Mario Bergoglio, both as pontiff and as man. From the very first meeting with him at the conclave in 2005, a succession of intimate and unpublished moments that the journalist decided to share in order to remember and celebrate a pope who, in the twelve years of his pontificate, was able to change the face of the Church by bringing it back to the midst of men, reaching out not only to the faithful but also to many lay people who precisely thanks to him have drawn closer to God. An uncommon pontiff who, although sometimes finding himself in the midst of controversy, never backed down in the face of difficulties, always taking the side of the poor, migrants, young people, the elderly, the weakest, too often forgotten, asking for mercy and dignity for them. 

LEO XIV The pope who came for peace Domenico Agasso

In the late afternoon of May 8, after only four ballots, the new pope of the Catholic Church was elected. In the frenzied predictions chasing each other in the preceding days, his was certainly not among the most popular names. As such, it was a surprise to many to see Robert Francis Prevost, the first North American (and Augustinian) to become pontiff, appear from the balcony of St. Peter's. He chose the name Leo XIV, perhaps in continuity with that Leo XIII who has gone down in history for the encyclical "Rerum Novarum" in which the Church for the first time took a stand on social issues. At a difficult time for the planet, amid ongoing and announced wars, an economy in crisis, the difficulties of international dialogue and social conflicts, it is hoped that this pope can open new paths of peace and brotherhood. In continuity with Francis, the very word "peace" was one of the first and most uttered by the new successor of Peter. For many years a bishop in Chiclayo, Peru, Prevost has always had a special concern for the last, the poor, but without ever losing sight of the centrality of God. His is a name that, it is hoped, will be able to bring together and hold together the whole Church: his figure is, for many, the synthesis between the institutional and missionary Church. However, that left by Bergoglio is not an easy legacy to pick up: will the new pontiff be able to fill the empty space left by Francis in the hearts of millions?

Born in 1979 in Carmagnola and a graduate in political science, vaticanist Domenico Agasso is a journalist and author. He works for "La Stampa" newspaper as coordinator of the "Vatican Insider", the independent website on Vatican affairs and the initiatives of the Pope. He is the author of several books. He has followed Pope Francis in many of his international visits, and obtained two exclusive interviews for his newspaper, in August 2019 and March 2020. He's been editor of Pope Francis book *Dio e il mondo che verrà* [God and the world to come]


After 27 years at the helm of the Catholic Church, the death of Pope John Paul II on April 2, 2005, shocked the entire world, despite being preceded by a long illness. Until the very end, John Paul II remained steadfast on the papal throne, enduring surgeries, a tracheostomy tube, difficulty speaking, and Parkinson's disease. Even in his final moments, he continued to appear at the third-floor window to bless and greet the evergrowing crowd gathered in St. Peter's Square—people who, in the end, came together in collective mourning to bid farewell to a pope who not only transformed the face of the Church but also changed the world. Twenty years after that historic event, Vatican journalist Orazio La Rocca meticulously retraces the days from John Paul II's first emergency hospitalization at Gemelli Hospital in February 2005 to April 2 and beyond, covering his funeral and the organization of the new conclave. This moving chronicle takes readers on a journey into the past, reliving those unforgettable and intense moments when the tiny Vatican City seemed to hold the entire world within its walls. Packed with details and previously unpublished revelations, this is an essential book to remember a Pope who left behind an undisputed legacy—and many unanswered questions becoming a central figure in history and shaping the world we live in today.

Orazio La Rocca, born in 1950, is a professional journalist and has been a Vatican expert for leading newspapers and magazines for 40 years. He has collaborated with the CEI Communications Office, Vatican Radio, Il Messaggero, L'Osservatore Romano, and Panorama. He has written numerous books, including The Year of the Three Popes (San Paolo, 2018), Ratzinger: The Choice – "I Did Not Run Away" (San Paolo, 2023), and Traveling with the Pietà (San Paolo, 2024).

BENEDICT XVI The theologian, the pope, the man Andrea Tornielli

The passing of Benedict XVI on December 31, 2022, opened a wound in the Vatican, upending already fragile balances and exacerbating the clash between the supporters of Pope Francis and the more conservative wing of the clergy. Andrea Tornielli retraces the life of the Pope Emeritus, from his childhood in Germany to his studies in theology, from his first steps in the Vatican alongside John Paul II to his election to the papacy and his resignation. The author explores the lights and shadows of a man accused by many of hyper-conservativism, labeled a «strict and inflexible inquisitor», overshadowed by scandals such as the Vatileaks and the sexual abuse cases. And yet, if we make the effort to go beyond cliches and resist the temptation to settle for slogans, we discover a different Ratzinger – a man who was attentive to the protection of the environment, of peace, of the poor and marginalized.



HOPE NEVER LETS YOU DOWN Pilgrims towards a better world Pope Francis

In this book, one of his last ones and inspired by the Jubileum, Pope Francis offers his readers his vision of hope, as well as recounting the role of hope in both his and his predecessors' magisterium, in literature and, more broadly, in the history of humanity. Pope Francis analyses the major issues of our times through an array of «figures» providing a glimmer of hope.

An expectant mother introduces the issues of families, natality, and the Church; an indigent man opens a discussion on the social, political, and economic situation at a global level; a refugee offers the opportunity to reflect on migrations and geopolitics; a civilian in a war zone to speak of the hope for peace; the figures of a senior and a preteen together epitomize the opportunities and shared challenges we must face.

In conclusion, the Pope points to concrete actions in order to build, through hope, a better world while confronting the great challenges of the future, such as the development of artificial intelligence and the consequences of climate change.

The Holy Year has been the fulfilment of a strong wish of the Pope and was meant to be a turning point for the Church and beyond.





He decides to call her Tempesta (Storm), and just like a strong storm, the animal will sweep away what was there before, changing her human's life forever. Through Tempesta's eyes, we enter Don Cosimo's life, his daily routine of prayer and joy in helping others. With a delicate and original narrative, it is the little dog who tells us about their days, their discoveries, and their difficult moments. All this with an innocent but deeply wise gaze that reveals the value of unconditional love, mutual care, and presence, leaving the reader with food for thought to pause, dig a little deeper, and discover something new about themselves.

Born in 1970, Cosimo Schena is a priest of the Diocese of Brindisi Ostuni. He graduated in and Clinical Philosophy and Dvnamic Psychology, obtained a PhD in Philosophy from the Pontifical Lateran University, and specialized in Brief Strategic Psychotherapy, an innovative approach to the treatment of various forms of psychopathology. He has published books of poetry and essays on philosophy. He is the most followed priest on social networks in Italy, where he shares reflections, columns, and invitations to love, peace, and care for creation. "I'm just going to see, just to see." This is what Marta repeats to herself as she heads toward the encounter that will change her life. A simple car ride that becomes a "pilgrimage " and leads her to Ruth, the little dog who from that day on breaks into her everyday life, upsetting habits, beliefs and conventions and leading her on a path of rediscovery of herself and the profound meaning of living. At first Marta is unable to penetrate the mysterious world of the animal, to break down her wall of distrust. She tries to meet her needs, wonders where she is going wrong, why Ruth is not affectionate and tame. As in all relationships, it will take time to understand each other and learn to give and take space, until a fulfilling but fragile balance is reached, one that should never be taken for granted. Grinding through miles of woods and concrete on their long walks, Marta and Ruth will discover a new and life-giving experience of the Other. The struggle to get to know each other, the courage to try, the hope that something might change, the fear, the anger, the love that can move everything. Ruth, with her pacing, will show the way to small and hidden signs of Life and will impart to Martha a series of lessons about existence, relationships, and relationship with God that are now encapsulated in this book: surprising and touching pages, a caress in a present in which we seldom stop to reflect on the simplest, perhaps trivial things, but which often, like Ruth with Martha, show us the way to authentic and lasting happiness.

Marta Monfrinotti was born in Rome. At the age of 17 a chance encounter with a priest brought her closer to the faith. She left as a missionary in Kazakhstan, then graduated in Psychology from La Sapienza University and, after various work experiences, started the adventure of *Venite Benedetti*, a place of welcome and encounter, where to try to rediscover one's talents and enter into a relationship with others and with God, which has now become an association run together with Sister Fernanda.





THE MIRACLE OF HOSPITALITY

Luigi Giussani

"Under the impulse of the Spirit, the family unit not only welcomes life by generating it within itself but also opens up, stepping beyond its own boundaries to share its goodness with others, to care for them, and to seek their happiness. This openness is particularly expressed through hospitality. [...] When a family welcomes and reaches out to others, especially the poor and the abandoned, it becomes a 'symbol, testimony, and participation in the motherhood of the Church.'"

The awareness of the decisive role of the family in the Church and the contemporary world, as expressed in these words by Pope Francis, is reflected in the talks and dialogues given by Don Giussani to the groups of the "Families for Hospitality" association. This organization has been committed for many years to promoting and supporting foster care, adoption, and the experiences of families who open their homes to those in need. The word hospitality —of which foster care and adoption are synonymous— thus defines the identity of a family that, with gratitude and dedication, remains open to life, recognizing its sacred and irreducible nature beyond mere human measurement. Today, it is from this reality of family that we must begin again to effectively and humanely address the crises —geopolitical, economic, environmental, and, above all, moral— that weigh upon the contemporary world.

Born in 1922, **Don Luigi Giussani** studied Theology and specialized in "American Protestant theology and the rational motivation for faith and adherence to the Church". He left seminary teaching to work in high schools. For 26 years he's been teaching Introduction to Theology at the Catholic University in Milan. He authored numerous essays, translated into multiple languages, many of which have become classics of Christian faith and spirituality. In the mid-1950s, he founded the Communion and Liberation movement, which has since spread in more than 90 countries worldwide. Don Giussani passed away in 2005 and the homily was delivered by Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger. Declared a Servant of God in 2012, the diocesan phase of his cause for beatification and canonization is currently underway.
