The unconventional grandmother of this modern Little Red Riding Hood had been a music hall singer and married several times. The wolf is Mr. Woolf, a multimillion-aire pastry chef who lives near Central Park in a skyscraper shaped like a cake. But the enchanted key to this story centers on Miss Lunatic, a highly peculiar beggar who hides in the Statue of Liberty by day and comes out at night to help alleviate human misfortune.

CARMEN MARTÍN GAITE

(Salamanca, 1925-Madrid, 2000) was one of the great writers of contemporary Spanish literature, Author of works such as Entre visillos (Behind the Curtains, winner of the Nadal Prize in 1957), El cuarto de atrás (The Back Room, 1978) and Nubosidad variable (Variable Cloud, 1992), her voice was sensitive and intimate, but courageous, lucid, and deeply independent as well. This made her a unique writer who wrote both to understand herself and to converse with others, something she was passionate about and, like Miss Lunatic, something never tired of.

HELENA BONASTRE

(Barcelona, 1991) is an illustrator and animator trained in London, where she developed part of her work drawing for film and television. In her work, the clear lines draw a vibrant, colorful world, full of detail, leading the reader to immerse themselves in it, going deeper into the image. In Little Red Riding Hood in Manhattan, she has managed to capture the personality and emotions of unforgettable characters, bringing them to life within the omnipresent setting of New York City by night.

CATALINA GONZÁLEZ VILAR

(Alicante, 1976) is a writer of children's and young adult literature. She has authored novels, picture books, comic book scripts, and plays, receiving awards such as the Barco de Vapor and the Children's and Young Adult Award from the Barcelona Comic Fair. She read Little Red Riding Hood in Manhattan as a teenager, and working on this adaptation has allowed her to once again enjoy the humor, intelligence, and love of language that run through every page of the novel.
